


WEEKLY CHALLENGE


The books of the Bible are gathered into two parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament tells about what happened up until the time when God's Son, Jesus, was born. The New Testament tells what happened after Jesus came into the world.

Split up into teams. See if your team can memorize and name all the books in the Bible. You have one week to do it. Ready? Set? Go!

Hint: There are 66 books, 39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament. Divide them among your team members to memorize. Older team members can help the younger ones.
